Objective: The goal of this project is to **design**, **evaluate**, **AND refine a solution for reducing the impacts of human activities on the environment.** You will **select a country** to research and design your solution based on the environmental impact of that country. Your presentation may either be a slideshow, or a poster, follow the grading rubric to insure all necessary elements are included.

Task 1: Group Selection

1. Select a group of **FOUR** people. Yes, you must have **FOUR** or <u>less</u>, no more than **FOUR**.

Task 2: Country Selection

- 1. As a group, select a country that you would like to research. You may **NOT** choose the United States.
- 2. When you have decided, sign up with the teacher, there will only be 1 group allowed per country.

Task 3: Country Culture Research

The first part of this project is to get to know the country you have chosen to research. Use the following questions as a *GUIDE* of what to research. You are not expected to include ALL of this information on your poster, or on the culture slide of your presentation. You ARE expected to demonstrate an understanding of important aspects of the culture, economy, resources, politics, and conflicts of this country.

CULTURE

- 1. What is the population of the country?
- 2. Where does the majority of the population live in rural areas, or urban areas?
- 3. What is the birth rate in the country?
- 4. In which stage of the demographic transition model is this country currently?
- 5. Has this country exceeded its carrying capacity, if so how is this being addressed?
- 6. What is the typical family structure in this country?
- 7. What cultural practices are shared by a majority of the population?
- 8. Are there any cultural practices that require the use of extra resources?
- 9. Are there any cultural practices that conserve resources?
- 10. What cultural expectations are there surrounding education, and the roles of women and children?

ECONOMY and RESOURCES

- 11. What products are imported from other countries? What products are exported to other countries?
- 12. How does this country access water and food? How does it produce energy? (coal, nuclear, etc.)

13. Are any resources overused?

14. What is the average ecological footprint of a person in this country?

POLITICS and CONFLICT

- 15. Are there any political situations that affect the environment or natural resources of this country?
- 16. What human activities in this country negatively impact the environment?

ON YOUR POSTER OR IN YOUR PRESENTATION SLIDE MAKE SURE TO INCLUDE: an age structure diagram, the demographic transition stage, and any information that is important to consider when studying the human impact of this particular country

Task 4: Design a Solution

- 1. Select ONE human activity from this country that negatively impacts the environment.
- 2. List several social and cultural practices of the people of your country that contribute to the issue.

- 3. Design a solution to reduce the impact of this activity, include at least 3 detailed steps the country could take as part of this solution.
- 4. Explain why this solution would work to reduce human impact by describing how this solution will decrease the negative effects of human activity. Describe predicted outcomes of this solution if it were to be implemented.
- 5. Describe constraints of your solution (factors that would make the solution challenging) **OTHER THAN COST**.
- 6. Consider and list at least 2 unintended consequences of your proposed solution (possible side effects).

ON YOUR POSTER OR IN YOUR PRESENTATION SLIDE MAKE SURE TO INCLUDE: a description of the solution, an explanation of why it would work, challenges of implementing the solution, and possible unintended consequences

Task 5: Evaluate an Existing Solution

- 1. Research several solutions for this human activity that are used in **OTHER** countries.
- 2. Select ONE solution that may work the best for your focus country, describe the solution, and describe how effective it has been in the country/ies that use it. (How does it help the environment, and what positive impacts has it had?)
- 3. Justify why this solution would work to reduce human impact better for your focus country than the other solutions you researched. Consider the culture, economics, and politics of the country.

ON YOUR POSTER OR IN YOUR PRESENTATION SLIDE MAKE SURE TO INCLUDE: a description of the solution, an explanation of its effectiveness, and an explanation of why it is the best existing solution for your focus country including cultural details

Task 6: Refine a Country-specific Solution

<u>There is no perfect solution</u> to addressing the impact of human behavior on the environment and biodiversity. Solutions must inspire humans to change their behavior. See Figure 1. For this reason it is important to consider how to make environmental solutions as user-friendly as possible. The following are guiding questions to help you brainstorm how to make the most effective solution for your focus country.

- 1. Considering the solution you designed and the solution you researched, and describe a solution that you feel would be the most effective for your focus country (this can be your solution, the researched solution, or a combination).
- 2. What objections might people in the country give to your solution, and how would you address them?
- 3. Can you prioritize the steps of your solution? Which steps would have to happen before change can occur?
- 4. Can you identify trade-offs or compromises that would have to be made to increase buy-in from the people?
- 5. How can you get the people of your country to buy-into your solution? What would you do differently than has already been tried?
